
From the Pastor

Reach out, engage, and invite them to the Church, where they can find peace and strength through the word of God and fellowship with brothers and sisters in Christ.

By the way, Julie came back home with a big smile from the very first school day. I knew why she wanted to go back to school tomorrow because of her friends.

Now, are you excited to go to church along with your friends?

MMMMM!!!! Can you smell that? It's the aroma of apple pies. Can you believe fall is around the corner and that means it is apple pie time. That smell will be wafting through the church in the weeks to come. We will be asking for donation of time, sugar, flour, eggs, butter, shortening, monetary donations. You may wonder what are we talking about. The week of October 13th through the 18th the church is abuzz making apple pies. How many you ask? This year we are cutting back to around 300. I know I said only 300 pies, we have made more. How do we accomplish this feat? First we ask for donations for the ingredients to make the pies (sign up sheet in the narthex), next we gather everyone that would like to help out on Monday, October 13th (which is Columbus Day a holiday for some) starting at 9AM until 9PM (we don't expect people to stay the entire time, but an hour or two is such a great help)

We even provide lunch and dinner. We repeat this schedule on Wednesday, October 15th and if we have to we finish on Saturday, October 18th. We bake some of the pies, some are sold and picked up that week, and the rest are frozen for future sales. All the money raised from this event is put in the general fund for the church expenses. At \$10 a pie we will raise at least \$3000 for the church, have had fun doing it and have a tasty treat to enjoy. Now you ask what can you do? You can donate ingredients or make a monetary donation (we are pretty thrifty shoppers), you can join us making the pies (there is a job for everyone-young or old, man or woman, experienced-unexperienced)-we really do have a lot of fun, it's a social event too and lastly SELL! SELL! And SELL! Or BUY! BUY! And BUY! We have order sheets if you would like to sell pies to co-workers, family, friends & neighbors. The pies are sold baked or frozen and they keep for a long time, as many of our parishioners can attest to. So order enough for the year.


