Greetings United Women in Faith!

This has been a tough few weeks to watch the news. The invasion of Ukraine stirs up many memories and events from the past. It seems that the world continues to be caught in cycles of oppression and greed for territory, power, and personal influence. I am reminded that we have to make things right in our own back yards for the world to be a better place for women, children and youth. And this begins with Lent and a serious reflection on who we are as **United Women in Faith.**

Yes- we have changed our name – but our purpose and priorities remain the same. We are called to act on behalf of women, children and youth and to respond with faith, action and sisterhood.

As some of you know, I participate in the Reading Program – these books are varied and offer different viewpoints into the world from what I would otherwise get on Facebook, listening to the nightly news or conversations at work. But the most recent book I read was not from the reading program. It is by Jodi Picoult, titled "W*ish You Were Here*", and is a story about one woman's COVID experience over the last 2 years. Even though it is fiction, the book describes in detail all that we have gone through – acknowledging our uncertainty, fears, frustration and isolation.

But the point of the book is not to rehash what happened in the last 2 years but to go forward. As the book points out - It doesn't matter what happened or how we addressed it. It matters how we go on from here and what choices we make with our time and talents and money. The specific quote from the book that sticks with me is this:

"The truth is it doesn't matter how or why It never will. Trying to figure out what happened isn't important. It is what I do with what I learned that counts. All of us are grieving something. We are putting one foot in front of the other, we are waking up to see another day, we are pushing through uncertainly even if we can't yet see the light at the end of the tunnel. We are battered and broken, but we are all small miracles."

Yes – you and I are small miracles – and what we do matters. What we do from here forward matters. We have a new name – *United Women in Faith* – and what we do with this new name and the spark it starts matters. I hope that each of you will reflect on the last 2 years – but not dwell in it – and choose to move forward. Be the spark needed for United Women in Faith. Invite women to participate. Make United Women in Faith a personal priority! Because we are all miracles – spreading our wings for women, children and youth.

This tip is on Proof Reading.

Definition of Proof reading is: to read and mark corrections in (something, such as a proof).

Proofread with Care

Secretaries you have been entrusted with a heavy responsibility and while accuracy of information is your primary goal, you also have the obligation of making that information understandable to others. It won't be if you don't proofread every word you typed. You will also blow your credibility as a reliable information provider if you produce minutes that are filled with misspell words, incomplete sentences, abbreviations and inaccurate punctuation. Take pride in your work, and keep in mind the expression: **"What's worth doing is worth doing well."**

I hope this finds you all well and happy. Spring is almost here!

How many of you have joined in virtually to Voices from the Field or Faith Talks?

These are wonderful mission programs that would be great for programs with you District or with your local units. Voices from the Field focus on national and international initiatives supporting mission giving. How our monies are being used in the mission field. Voices from the Field are offered quarterly. Faith Talks are monthly discussions/conversations that explore themes and resources to empower us to put Faith, Hope and Love into action. Faith Talk podcasts can now be counted in the category of Spiritual Growth. You must participate or listen to two Faith Talks podcasts. If you participate/listen to three, it will be counted as a Bonus Book in the Spiritual Growth category.

Reading Program: It was determined that enlarging the 2021 list and combining the 2021 and 2022, Reading Lists, would be a better way to handle the situation for now due to Covid. The new list will be out in July 2022. Think of new ways to enjoy the books, such as Zoom book clubs or by sharing book reports. Invite book authors to join you for discussions time, programs, etc. Mix it up by recognizing books in 2021 and the Faith Talks podcasts, movies, and books in 2022. Movies and documentaries will also count toward the Reading Program. Here are the movies selected: "Just Mercy, "The Hate U Give" and "Pushout". Think of other creative ways to promote the Reading Program.



- Stafford Street is off of Route 20 and the church is about 2/3^{rds} of a mile up the road. The church will be on the Right and is set back off of the road. Sinage is clear and visible.
- From the West: Either access Route 20E and follow it through Sturbridge to Charlton or take the Mass Pike, Route 90E, to the Sturbridge Exit (old #9, new #78). Take Route I-84W to Exit 6A which will connect you to Route 20E. Stafford Street will be on the Left after about 5.2 miles and the church will be up the road 2/3^{rds} of a mile on the Right.
- From the North: Stafford Street is a very long street that goes all the way into Worcester. Depending on where you are, GPS recommends different routes, not necessarily via Route 20.
- From the East: Again, depending on your starting point, GPS may not suggest using Route 20W. If you are directed to use Route 20W, Stafford Street will be on the Right and the church will be up the road 2/3^{rds} of a mile on the Right.
